## Rabbi/Hazzan David B. Sislen

### NOTES FROM THE RABBI/HAZZAN

I suppose you couldn't blame Tu B'shvat if it developed an inferiority complex. The other holidays have their special prayers, unique foods, ancient traditions, rules and regulations. Tu B'shvat, the New Year of the Trees, has its foods, its traditions, and its liturgies but they are all relatively new and open to interpretation. The custom of holding a Tu B'shvat Seder had its origins with the mystics, but none of the prayers, readings, or foods are set in stone. While every Tu B'shvat observance centers around nature/agriculture in general and trees in particular, the variety of different rituals, themes, and degree to which they parallel the better-known Pesach version is all over the map. But despite the confusion, I happen to think that Tu B'shvat is one of the most important holidays we have. All the rest of our holidays are either *mitzvot* which were commanded by G-d in the Torah or are a commemoration of some historical or cultural event. Tu B'shvat, the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month of Shvat, commemorates a change of season; a seemingly random choice of a date where winter begins to turn to spring in Israel. (Hillel and Shammai disagreed on the date in the Talmud, but, what else is new?) But since it celebrates something which is yet to be, Tu B'shvat is a holiday of tremendous faith. We trust that G-d's seasonal cycles will continue to operate as they should, and we celebrate the bounty that nature provides. Even more importantly, however, in most modern Tu B'shvat sedarim, we recognize our role in preserving and maintaining the blessing of resources we have. That makes Tu B'shvat one of the most forward-thinking holidays we have. Tu B'shvat looks to the future rather than symbolically remembering the past. On Yom Kippur we review our past year in order to ensure our future. On Pesach, we remember slavery to better appreciate freedom. On Sukkot and Shavuot we are grateful for what we have. On Tu B'shvat, we renew our commitment to protect and maintain the planet. Last spring will never come again. But it is up to us in partnership with G-d to ensure that future springs will.



I hope you will be able to join us on **Sunday evening, February 9 at 6:30pm**. KZ and RCOS will be joining together for a festive Tu B'shvat seder. In the meantime, think about what you can do to hold up your end of the bargain with G-d. Plant a tree, both in Israel and here. Recycle. Reduce your carbon footprint, and support businesses and causes which do so. And on Tu B'shvat, be sure to wish your favorite tree a Shana Tova!


